



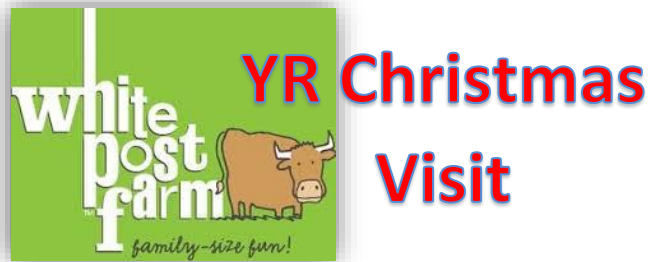

Dear parent/carer

We have arranged an exciting festive visit to the White Post Farm Park for the Tiger Cubs. Children (and staff) will take part in a festive timetable of activities, including seeing Santa and listening to him read a special Christmas story.

Our visit is arranged for Wednesday 17th December and will be a great finale for our last 2025 school term. We will leave after registration and return in time for the end of the school day at 3.30pm.

Children will need to wear jeans or joggers with a school t-shirt and jumper for the visit; they will also need a warm coat and sensible footwear (wellies if possible).

We are asking for a contribution of £22.85 per child. Payment must be made via Parentpay and can be paid by instalments if this is more convenient. Those families in receipt of free school meals may contact the office for alternative payment details. Whilst no child can be excluded for reasons of non-payment, the visit may have to be cancelled if there are insufficient funds. **Payment in full will need to be made by Wednesday 19th November, please.**

As EYFS & KS1 pupils are in receipt of Government funded meals, we can offer children a packed lunch for the day consisting of a sandwich, piece of fruit and cake with a bottle of water. Please indicate on Parentpay if you would like to order one and your choice of ham/cheese/tuna. Lunch orders along with payment will need to be in by Wednesday 19th November, please.

As usual the local authority guidelines are followed and staffing/adult ratios are appropriate for the number and age of the children going on this visit. All the necessary risk assessments have been completed and appropriate safety measures are in place. However, under recent legislation we have to remind you that there are risks with any activity and that we expect the same high standards of behaviour from our pupils on visits as we do during the normal school day.
